CHM 262H: Honors General Chemistry II (Natural Sciences)

MWF, 12:25 - 1:15

Kinetics, equilibrium, acid-base chemistry, nuclear chemistry, and descriptive chemistry.

PHY 243H: University Physics I (Natural Sciences, WAC)

(TTh, 8:00 - 9:50; LAB on Thursdays 10:00-11:50)

Calculus based honors physics, with laboratory. Topics include mechanics, thermodynamics, acoustics

HIS 243H: Dirt, Disease, and Public Health in Premodern Europe (Arts and Humanities, WAC)

TTh, 10:00 - 11:15

Examination of how premodern Europeans managed their environments and the experience of disease between 1200 and 1700.

PSY 101H: Introduction to Psychology (Social Sciences)

MWF, 11:20 - 12:10

Survey of psychology, including coverage of methodology and measurement; intelligence and personality; psychological disorders and their treatment; the biological bases of behavior; social influence and persuasion; learning; and perception, memory, and cognition.

ART 253H: (Arts and Humanities)

TTh. 12:30 - 1:45

ART 253H is a general introduction to the history of Western art. It is designed for the beginning student and assumes no previous experience in art or art history. ART 253H acquaints students with the historical development of art in Western Europe and the United States from the early Renaissance to the late 1970s. Lectures and discussions focus on how art functions in particular cultural and historical contexts. ART 253H also introduces students to the discipline of art history and to strategies for analyzing, interpreting, and writing about visual art and culture. The class will visit the Cleveland Museum of Art.
